Wapsie Valley Schools' District Newsletter, November 2010

Superintendent's Note: The month of November is an important one for Wapsie Valley Schools. In the next few weeks, students across the district will be assessed through the Iowa Test of Basic Skills and Iowa Test of Educational Development. As a district, we use the data collected through these tests in many ways: to help us determine if our instruction is meeting the needs of students, if our curriculum is aligned across the district, and to help us determine if students need extra support or additional challenges as part of their education. Specifically, at the jr./sr. high school level, we use the ITED to determine placement in our second chance reading course for students who need more support in the area of reading. Also, at the high school level, Iowa law now requires that for students to be eligible for PSEO (post-secondary enrollment option) courses, or dual-enrollment courses (courses that are taken for both college and high school credit), students must now be proficient in reading, math, and science based on their ITED scores. If you plan to have your son or daughter enroll in these college credit courses while they are enrolled in high school, they must meet the 41st percentile rank to be considered proficient. Further, our K-12 district performance is measured by the Department of Education based on these tests. They truly are a high stakes test for our kids and our staff, and we need all students to put forth their best effort so that we can get an accurate picture of how our students are growing, and what the district needs to do to better meet your child's needs. Thank you for reminding your student how important these tests are as they prepare to take them in the next few weeks.

You're probably familiar with the popular series of books *Chicken Soup for the Soul*. These books are collections of stories, many about real people and events that are inspiring and heartwarming, and remind us of the goodness of the human spirit, and the success that can be attained by a little teamwork, perseverance, and inner strength. This month, I thought I'd share with you the first installment of *Chicken Soup for the Warrior's Soul*, a book dedicated to the great feats of students, staff, and citizens in the Wapsie Valley district. While I can't guarantee that Jack Canfield and his editors will pick up on this story and publish it, the following is a great reminder to me of the strength and power that exists when Wapsie Valley Warriors come together for a common cause.

Several weeks ago, a truck arrived at Fairbank Elementary School, and playground equipment for our pre-school students was delivered, and later that day, the same truck, with an identical set of equipment, delivered to Readlyn Elementary. Late in September, work began to prepare the sites for installation of the equipment. Local contractors teamed with school maintenance staff to prepare the ground, dig holes, level the site, and collect the tools and equipment needed to install the playground equipment. Without the expertise and equipment of our own custodial staff, along with the skill and flexibility of local contractors, the first step in the project would not have been possible.

A Wednesday in early October was a day that I won't soon forget at Wapsie Valley. At 8:00 a.m., a representative of the equipment manufacturer arrived at Fairbank Elementary School, and at about that same time, local citizens

also arrived, many with tools and gloves in hand, ready to begin the work of the day. I'm not sure how many of you have spent time working on a task like this one, and I'm not sure I can do it justice by describing it here, but imagine seeing hundreds and hundreds of nuts, bolts, and washers spread out on a table. Some are in bags with 5-6 of the same size, while others are in bags with 50-60 of the same size. These pieces are all designed to connect the 100 or so pieces of tubing, railing, slides, and platform of the equipment. The work began, with a group of about twelve, ranging in age from 30 to 80. Some had been "recruited" only a couple days before, others stayed to help after they dropped off their children at our school, and some others came to help on a moment's notice when we needed an extra set of hands. No one complained about the work. Nearly everyone smiled to see Wapsie Valley students standing wide-eyed at the window watching the project unfold. Some of those who came to work were retired, and gave up other plans they had for the day, while others took time away from work to participate. As I said, some brought their own tools. Some brought experience in putting equipment like this together in the past. All brought a willingness to work hard for the kids at Wapsie Valley elementary schools.

When the work was completed on the Fairbank equipment, the team moved to Readlyn, and the same process took place there. Sometime after 6:00 p.m. that night, the equipment in Readlyn was finished as well, and those who had helped stepped back and looked at the work that had been done. I'm not sure if they were proud, or tired, or surprised, but I will say that as I looked around at that group of Wapsie Valley Warriors that day—parents, staff members, and citizens—I did have to smile a bit and think about the power of the Warriors.

This "simple" activity demonstrated that when staff members join with parents and community members, much can be accomplished. It demonstrated that when the tools of one person are shared and placed in the hand of an expert or willing worker, great work can get done. It was a prime example of the power and influence that people from the community can have on their school, whether they have kids in the building or not.

I learned a lot on that day, and not just about lock-tite and digging holes. I learned about the district, and I was reminded of the power of the community in supporting our kids and our schools. As I've mentioned before, the Wapsie Valley Education Foundation donated over \$17,000 to purchase the equipment, and without their volunteer hours to fundraise, we probably would not have that equipment in place today. That Wednesday in October was like a lot of days at Wapsie Valley, but because I saw it first-hand, it was a day I'll always remember.

For those that donated time, money, and expertise, thank you for that: You know who you are. And thank you, as well, for reminding me of the importance of the connection of kids, staff, and the community. As you see examples of that support and connection in our school district, don't let them pass unrecognized. They don't happen everywhere, and they are one of the reasons that it is a great day to be a Warrior.

Check out the playground equipment that is designated for our pre-school kids when you have a chance. Listen for them ringing the cowbell, and as always, Go Warriors! CGARBER
